Task 1: (Learning and Remembering)

Memorise the five main oceans of the world and order them largest to smallest. What strategies did you use to help you memorise them?

Challenge: Can you learn the names of the main seas of the world too?

Task 2: (Designing and Making)

Design a badge supporting and raising awareness of an environmental issue that you feel strongly about.

Mr Roberts has promised to make the best ones into real badges using his badge maker.

Task 3: (Researching and Writing)

Research how a body of water (river, sea or ocean) has been affected by pollution and what strategies have been put in place to clean it up. Using this information write a blog for the school website. This must be emailed to your class email account first for proofreading.

Year Five - 'Our Environment'- Home Learning

In the weeks leading up until Christmas, we would like to give you the flexibility to choose which Home Learning task suits you and your family routines. Some weeks you might be busier or have a lot on at the weekend, so you can choose what works best for you and when. But be aware, you do need to complete all of the six tasks before the Christmas holidays. You can hand in you work at any time, but don't leave it all until the last minute! We have given you six tasks to complete that cover a range of skills and support our learning in school. Enjoy your learning - we are excited to see what you produce!!

Task 4: (Reading and Writing)

Write a book review for the <u>Little Green</u> <u>Reading Review</u>. This is an opportunity to see your words in print and to support our whole school reading culture. You can follow the format of previous Reading Reviews - see these in the library! These should be emailed to class email accounts so they can be copied into the Reading Review.

Task 5: (Mindfulness and Well-Being)

Research and practise a technique to support mindfulness and well-being (E.g. Mindful colouring, GoNoodle.com or meditation) Write a short reflection of how this went, or teach someone in your family and ask them to write a reflection.

Task 6: (Outdoor Learning)

Go for a walk outside with a trusted adult and use natural objects to represent some of your maths learning from this year. Take a photo and either print it off, or email it to your class email account. Be creative and enjoy the outdoors!

Remember that this is in addition to normal reading, spelling and times tables homework. There may be additional maths activities to complete too.
