

Task 1: (Mindfulness and Well-Being)

Task 2: (Outdoor Learning)

Task 3: (Science week)


'Diversity' is the theme of science week (not the Dance group!) - what does it mean to you?

Task 4: (Writing)

Explore the following question:

Consider points for and against the statement above and construct a discursive piece of writing. If you need help with structuring this, talk to your teachers but it should contain researched statistics and official guidance.

Task 5: (Poetry - learning and performing)

Choose a poem that you enjoy, perhaps your favourite or one that you think you would like to share. Learn it, practise it and prepare to perform to the class. Try to choose one that not everyone will know!

Task 6: (World War Two)

Write and present a newspaper article explaining the causes of the Second World War. Include specific, accurate facts with good English. You could include quotes and images. Have a look at newspapers for an idea of how they present articles. Think about using headlines, and putting your work in columns.

Remember that this is in addition to normal reading, spelling and times tables homework. There may be additional maths activities to complete too.
